Work Study Jobs and Internships:

You'll work closely with a faculty mentor to thoroughly investigate a time, place and aspect of history of your choosing to cultivate your personal expertise before presenting preliminary research and a final in-depth oral presentation.

With small class sizes, students receive one-on-one attention from faculty, whose specialties encompass a broad range of areas, including Louisiana commercial and economic history, the American Civil War, the Civil Rights Movement, the Haitian Revolution, Medieval History and early 20th century English history.
