Receiving your I-20

- Submit your <u>Affidavit of Support</u> and sponsor's bank letter or statement to intinfo@mcneese.edu
- Review your I-20 carefully, and if no corrections are needed, print and sign the form on the bottom of page 1
- Schedule your visa interview with a <u>U.S.</u> <u>Embassy/Consulate</u> near you



SEVIS I-901 Fee and the Visa Process

- Pay the <u>I-901</u> fee **prior** to your interview
- Review the <u>U.S. Department of State's</u> website for helpful tips
- Complete the <u>DS-160</u> and pay applicable fees
- Bring all necessary documents
 - Signed I-20
 - Acceptance letter from McNeese
 - Financial documents
 - Valid passport
 - Photos as specified by the Embassy
 - DS-160 payment receipt
 - SEVIS I-901 payment receipt



HELPFUL TIPS FOR A SUCCESSFUL VISA INTERVIEW



DO

- Be honest and fully answer all questions asked
- Be confident about your upcoming educational journey at McNeese – know your program and how you plan to use your degree when you return home
- Be prepared to answer questions about how you'll finance your education
- Establish strong ties to your home country



DON'T

- Rehearse responses you think the officer wants to hear
- Memorize information about McNeese that has nothing to do with your degree program or academic goals
- Forget to emphasize how you will use your degree once you return home.
- Misrepresent any facts or information

Pre-travel Information

- Find the earliest admission date on your I-20
- Watch this <u>video</u> to learn what to expect at the Port of Entry
- Keep these documents on you – not in your checked luggage
 - I-20
 - Passport and visa
 - Financial documents
 - Acceptance letter
- When you arrive, an <u>I-94</u> will be created
- A Customs and Border Patrol agent will <u>interview</u> you



Arriving in Lake Charles

- If possible, fly into the <u>Lake Charles Airport</u>
- If you need ground transportation to the campus, you can use one of these services:
 - Yellow Cab Co. 337-433-8282
 - Fast Taxi 337-853-2534
 - \$10 Taxi Cab of Lake Charles 337-990-5573
 - LYFT (mobile app)
 - Request pickup by completing this <u>form</u> (we can only assist students arriving at the Lake Charles airport)

Items NOT to Bring

- Large amounts of cash (but make sure you have a reasonable amount of U.S. currency on you to cover your basic needs for at least the first week you are here)
- Any prohibited item listed <u>here</u>



CAMPUS HOUSING INFORMATION

- Some of the benefits of living on campus include proximity, safety, all-inclusive utilities, internet, on-site computer labs, and dormitories that are open year-round
- If you live on campus, a meal plan will be required
- Must sign a ten-month (August-May) lease agreement
- \$350 reservation fee due at signing (non-refundable)
- Priority placement deadlines are March 1st for the Fall semester and October 1st for the Spring semester
- International students should confirm move-in dates with Housing Office and schedule a move-in appointment PRIOR to booking flights

MANDATORY INTERNATIONAL STUDENT CHECK-IN

- All new international students are required to check in with International Student Services upon arrival. We recommend scheduling an appointment to avoid long wait times. You can email us at international office@mcneese.edu to schedule your check-in appointment.
- Participation in <u>Cowboy Camp</u> is separate from (and does not exempt you from) International Student Check-In
- Check your McNeese student email regularly for updates from our office
- Bring the following items with you to check-in:
 - Signed I-20
 - Passport and visa
 - Completed new student forms (if you are living on campus, you <u>must</u> include the NAME of your dorm as well as the room number; we cannot register your SEVIS record without this information)
 - Immunization documents (if you've brought copies with you)
 - A copy of your <u>I-94</u>

ACADEMIC ADVISING

- Pre-arrival advising and registration is strongly recommended
- All incoming freshmen have a Freshman Advisor based on their major
- All transfer students should reach out to their department head as soon as possible so they can be connected to their advisor within their major field of study
- · Graduate students should reach out to their department heads for academic advising
- It is your responsibility to reach out to your advisor and initiate the advising/registration process



- Once you are registered, sign up for the <u>F-1 Hub</u>. This is your PRIMARY method of requesting many services provided by our office, and it contains helpful resources and information about the campus and the Lake Charles area
- Graduate students in the mathematical sciences will be required to complete pre-registration testing. Please contact your advisor for full details.

Enrollment Requirements and Payment Options



Enrollment Requirements

- F-1 students must enroll in a full course of study each semester
 - Undergraduate students: 12 hours minimum
 - Graduate students: 9 hours minimum
- Only one 100% online class per semester may be counted toward the full course of study requirement
- Students are not required to enroll in summer courses
- Most courses are three credit hours
- We suggest less intensive courses for your first semester as you get acclimated to the U.S. educational system.



Tuition Payment Options

- Payment is handled by the Cashier's Office (Smith Hall), which can be reached at msucashiers@mcneese.edu
- If you'd like your on-campus housing and meal plan to show on your bill, please contact Housing to complete the EM-1 Form
- Payments can be made via FlyWire (recommended) or debit or credit card
- Exact estimates of the cost for your tuition and fees cannot be calculated until you register for classes



HEALTH INSURANCE AND HEALTHCARE INFORMATION

- Health insurance is mandatory and assessed as part of your fees
- Currently, health insurance is administered through <u>ISO Insurance</u> and is about \$200-\$300 per semester (but varies slightly each semester)
- This insurance is extremely basic and does not cover pre-existing conditions
- Many students opt to purchase supplemental health insurance
- Enrolled students at McNeese can use the Student Health Center on the corner of Ryan and W. Sale Streets
- Emergencies and after-hours care must be sought at area hospitals or urgent care facilities (please note that ER care in the U.S. is extremely expensive and should only be used in medical emergencies)
- Counseling services are available to enrolled students through the McNeese Counseling Center
- Familiarize yourself with the closest urgent care centers and hospitals, and have a plan to get to either in case of an urgent or emergent medical situation
